### Let's start with a Round of Applause for Middlefield

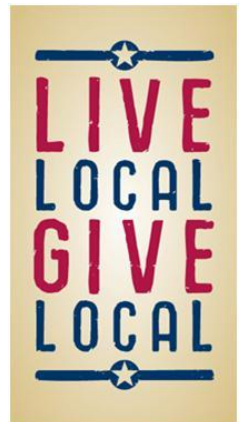


#### .....and its nonprofit organizations!
